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# D. Environment Development and Management program:

## D.1. Introduction:

The project was first started in the year 2006 as capacity building and planning phase for a period of 18 months supported by EED through RNBA. Followed by Main phase I for a period of 3 years (2008-2011) and Main Phase II for period of 3 years (2011-2014) and finally entering Main Phase III which is also for a period of 3 years (2014-2017).

The last three years and current program intervention is at Tausem area in six villages. Empowering the local level institutions towards livelihood security through better natural



resources management, capacity organization, appropriate livelihood options and setting the rights is our main thrust. Convergence with Govt. programs is also our major concern and ultimate improvement in local governance ensuring transparency & accountability, inclusiveness and responsible local institutions.

#### D.2. Key achievement

- Enhanced capacity of village level institutions towards secure and sustainable livelihood
- Enhanced access to land and control over food Production by the target communities;
- Vulnerabilities in the livelihoods of targeted communities addressed through practicing of viable market linked microenterprises by the women SHG;
- Enhanced access to and control of markets by the targeted communities;
- Enhanced community access and control over local natural resources in the Tamenglong district of Manipur;
- Promoted harmonious relationship among ethnic communities and durable peace in project area;
- Enhanced income through water resource augmentation, short term livelihood activities, land development and enhancement of skills.

# E. Enhancement of livelihood and promotion of food security program:

#### E.1. Introduction:

This project has been supported by Jamsedji Tata Trust (JTT) through Development & Relief department, RNBA since 2008 at Oinamlong area of Tausem Sub-Division including few villages in Assam bordering Manipur. Securing food basket and enhancing livelihood through proper natural resources management and appropriate livelihood activities is the main thrust of the project.

The main activities of the project are land development, water resource augmentation and livestock production (piggery, poultry and fishery). Target communities are the Rongmei and Kuki tribal of Manipur.

#### E.2. Key achievement:

- 20% income enhanced through piggery, poultry, fishery pond development and backyard nutrition garden
- Land development and water resource augmentation (check dam & irrigation channel) enhanced food production



 Capacity of the user groups and SHG enhanced in managing natural resources and assets developed

# F. Diversion Based Irrigation:

#### F.1. Introduction:

This year is the first year to take this project at PESCH target villages. It is implemented at Jarolpokpi a Hmar village in Jiribam. A check dam for fishery cum irrigation with canal lining has been developed. This dam is to enhance water harvesting, higher rate of water infiltration which will serve as fishery and irrigation. This will enhance production, productivity and intensity of production (no. of crops in a year).

Block Development Office, Jiribam, has admitted to work with the user group to enhance land development in the village area through NREGS during the inaugural program of the check dam.

## F.2. Key achievement:

- Capacity building imparted on poultry, convergence and fishery
- Livelihood revolving fund supported for poultry which enable to earn extra income of Rs. 5000 per 50 birds (kuroiler)
- Check dam for irrigation and fishery production developed for 20 farmers which enhance irrigation to the fields

## G. System of Rice Intensification:

#### **G.1.** Introduction:

This project has been supported since 2008 by Sir Dorabji Tata Trust (SDTT) since 2009. The project is aimed Promoting food security & ensuring a sustainable impact in the area of poverty reduction through **system of rice intensification** (SRI). The project is implemented in Jiribam area across different communities.



# **G.2.** Key achievement:

- Increase Number of Farmers who practice SRI up to 723
- Grain support given to 250 farmers
- Awareness and capacity building program conducted 13 times
- Which enable overall Food production increases to 10%

# H. Proper Natural Resources Management towards secure livelihood of the tribal:

#### H.1. Introduction:

This program has been supported by Coalition on Environment and Natural Resources (CENRs). Enhancing local community capacity to protect, promote and manage **natural resources towards secure livelihood of the tribal** is the main objective of the program. Ensuring tribal and marginal farmers land's rights and capacity organization of the community in managing the natural resources are the key

activities of the program. Ensuring equity and sustainability in managing natural resources, policy of natural resources governance and capacity organization of the tribal community are some of the issues placed by the coalition to address.

# H.2. Key achievement:

- Awareness on proper natural resources management conducted and reach out to around 1000 individuals
- Alternative livelihood skill on poultry, SRI, fishery, backyard nutrition garden and biodiversity garden imparted to 15 villages
- Natural resources management policy started developing in 7 villages
- Natural or organic food production promoted
- Legal awareness given on related policies of the Govt.

## I. Rural Micro Entrepreneurship Program (RMEP):

# I.1. Introduction:

**PESCH** is promoting entrepreneurship to rural farmers in livestock (poultry and piggery) production and fishery, carpentry with some petty business by providing training and small



loans. Our support is mainly capacity organization of the target members results and linkages with concern authorities.

## I.2. Key achievement:

- 15,000 chicks (kuroiler) able to acquire by target families
- Earned extra income around 10,000 per 100 birds
- Enhanced nutrition support to children by egg and poultry meat to target families (200 households)

# J. Reviving Govt. School at Taudaijang, Tamenglong:

#### J.1. Introduction:

Almost 65% of the students in Tamenglong district are sent to private institutions incurring huge expenditure. Rural families are mostly affected. Parents unable to visit and look after their wards on time and in need and the efforts they are giving (resources) are exhausted when their children reached ten (X) standards. Therefore, children drop out and other unwanted children's behavior is increasing which become social evils in the long run. Besides, this seriously affect livelihood of the rural families. Whereas Govt. is investing huge amount for children education with revised Act like RTE.

At Taudaijang Junior high school only few students were present (20-30). No regular staff, SMDC is functioning properly. Parents are finding great difficulties in sending their wards to outside school. Neither outside school nor local school is functioning properly. Parents spent huge amount of money besides unable to monitor them regularly. Therefore, our endeavor is to revive the existing Govt. schools particularly in the rural areas for desired change.

## J.2. Key achievement:

- 154 students from the village are attending the school and Information and application has been forwarded to ZEO & DC Tamenglong and local MLA
- Parents are more aware about having schooling in own village
- Teachers are oriented on RTE, teachings method (joyful learning method) and school planning developed for two years
- Reduce expenditure on schooling and able to spare more time for other livelihood activities
- Village Authority, Church and SMDC strengthened on quality education



# **K. Developing NREGS Perspective Plan:**

#### K.1. Introduction:

In an attempt to take an important step towards the realization of 'Right to work' The National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, 2005 (NREGA) is enacted by the Government of India. The Act guarantees 100 days of employment in a financial year to any rural household whose adult members are willing to do unskilled work. Recently the Lokshaba has passed 150 days of employment for the tribal. Initially, the Act is brought in force in 200 districts since February 2, 2006 which include Tamenglong district, and will be extended gradually to other areas notified by the Central Government.

The Act is in true sense a 'Peoples Act' because it was prepared through a wide range of consultations with peoples' organizations, secondly the Act addresses to working people and their fundamental right to life with dignity. Third, the Act empowers ordinary people to play an active role in the implementation of employment guarantee schemes through various means. The Act is prepared with an expectation that it will enhance peoples' livelihoods on sustainable basis, by developing the economic and social infrastructure in rural areas with durable assets development. The Act will address the reasons of poverty such as drought, deforestation and soil erosion.

However, expectations have not been met in the last several years. Therefore, PESCH strongly felt that proper planning must be developed which will enable better and proper implementation of the program.

# K.2. Key achievement:

- 32 volunteers train on MNREGS and its perspective for Tamenglong district
- Developed 5 years perspective plan for Tamenglong District (218 villages with a population of 1,56,784)
- Perspective shift from construction of connectivity (roads) towards income generating activities with sustainable natural resources management
